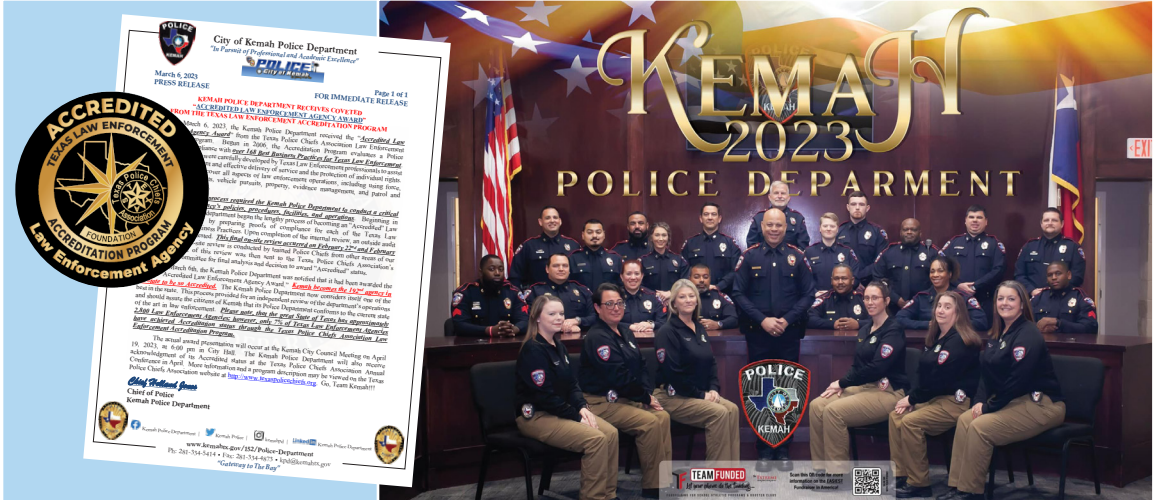

The Kemah Police Department Makes History!



Accreditation is a certification process where a criminal justice agency demonstrates complete compliance with a rigorous set of law enforcement standards. By demonstrating this compliance, an organization shows that it is committed to the highest level of excellence in all aspects of its daily operations.

The Texas Police Chiefs Association Best Practices Program, which is comprised of an independent Association of Chiefs of Police, is responsible for assessing an agencies policies and procedures. Their assessment also includes use of force reports and documentation, a very strict and in-depth analysis of the management and security of the agency's property and evidence, training records, and much more.

It is important to note that being "accredited" is not a mandatory

requirement of any law enforcement agency; however, the Kemah Police Department believes it is a critical component to our law enforcement goal of being professional, transparent, and accountable.

The process and commitment to the Accreditation Program for the Kemah Police Department started on September 7, 2021, when Police Chief Holland Jones was sworn into office, and because of the leadership of our elected and appointed officials, we celebrate the fact that we have successfully received the accreditation status as quoted from the email received from the Chairman of the TPCAF Accreditation Committee,

"On behalf of the Texas Police Chiefs Association Foundation, I want to officially notify you that the Kemah Police Department has achieved "Accreditation Status" for compliance with

the Texas Law Enforcement Accreditation Program... The Kemah Police Department is to be commended for the commitment made to this process. Every employee of the agency can be proud of this accomplishment... Again, please accept my sincere "Congratulations" on a job well done. The TPCAF Accreditation Program is raising the bar for Law Enforcement in Texas and the Kemah Police Department is part of it!"

The Kemah Police Department has been approved for two TXDOT grants as part of the Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP). This program is split into two divisions:

These grants will become effective on October 1, 2022

The Kemah Police Department is now the proud recipient of grant funds from the Texas Office of the Governor. Since the change of administration in September 2021, the Kemah Police Department has undergone changes to improve the overall image of the department and the services that we provide to the public.

In light of those changes, the Kemah Police Department began to seek alternate funding sources to acquire new ballistic shields that are mission-critical equipment for emergency situations. The journey to find, research, and secure

funding for ballistic shields for the officers of the Kemah Police Department began in August 2022.

After hard work and due diligence, we are now proud to announce that the Kemah Police Department has now been authorized and awarded a grant for the amount of \$66,602.03. These funds were awarded on January 9th, 2023, and will be used to acquire new and upgraded ballistic shielding for their police officers. Kemah Police Department strives daily to provide the best professional police services to the public and our local constituents by continuing to seek new and innovative ways to protect the public.

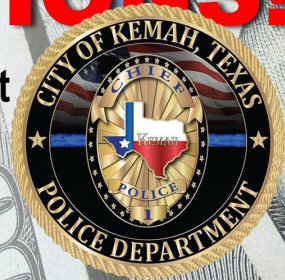

Sgt. Jones' deep and thorough knowledge of drones, answered many questions the class had about privacy laws and FAA regulations.

After the discussion, Sgt. Jones took the class away from their desks and out into the Kemah PD parking lot where they were able to see how a drone operates, hear what a drone sounds like, and observe what a drone operator sees on their screen when they are operating the drone.

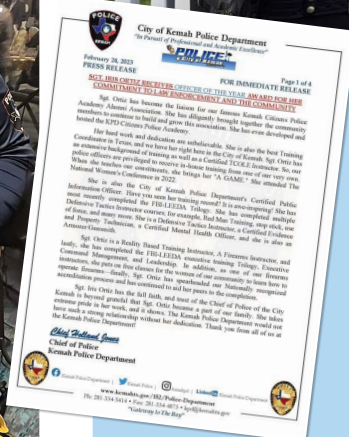
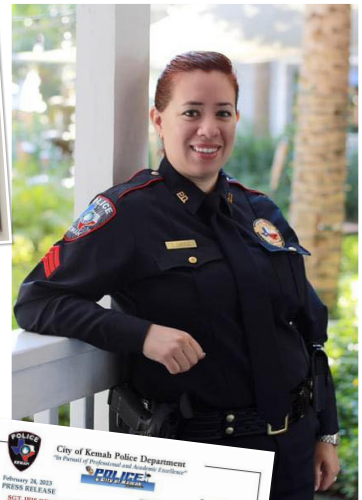
As a Patrol Investigator and Field Training Officer at the Kemah Police Department, Officer Sharp has identified criminal

FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Association Trilogy Award Winners



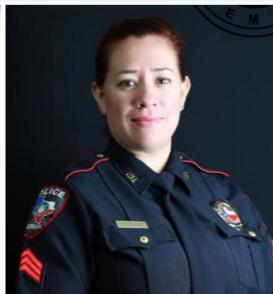
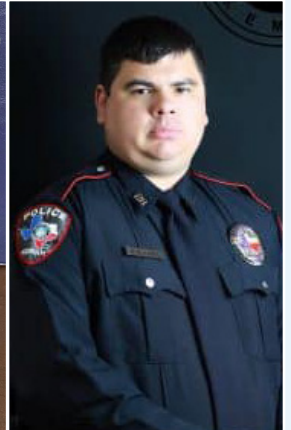
The Supervisor Leadership Institute (SLI), Command Leadership Institute (CLI), and the Executive Leadership Institute (ELI) are hosted by the FBI.

Enhanced 911 Text and Text to 911

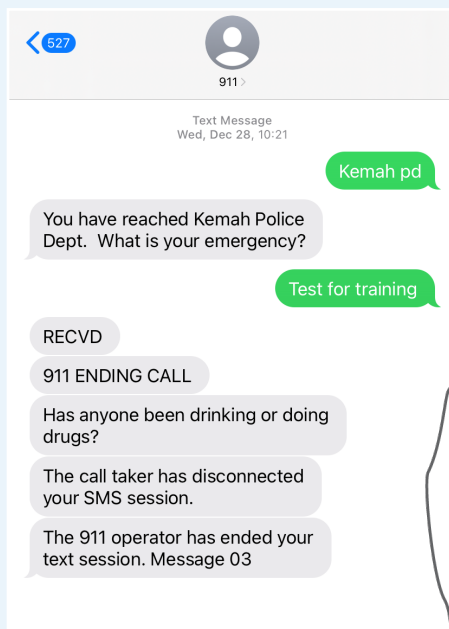
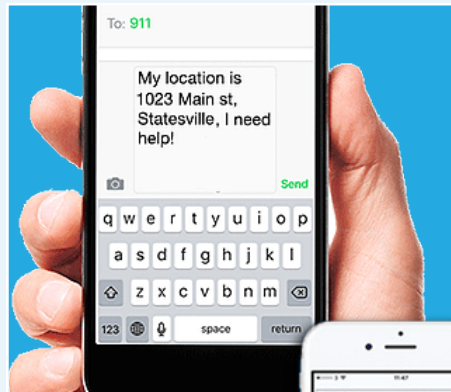


The Kemah Police Department staffs our emergency dispatch center 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, to provide the best police and emergency services to the residents and visitors of the City of Kemah.

In any emergency, you can dial 9-1-1 from your phone, and due to the enhanced 9-1-1 (E911) system, telecommunicators are provided general information that assists in locating the caller in case the caller requires law enforcement intervention and/or emergency medical services.

If in a situation where you cannot place a call, did you know that you can text 9-1-1? Through a service called "Text to 911", you can enter the number 911 in the "To" or "Recipient" field.

Please remember when utilizing this service, the text should be short. For example, the address or location should be given if police, fire, or ambulance services are needed, and push send. From this point, answer any questions and follow the instructions of the telecommunicator.

The Kemah Police Department hopes that everyone had a Happy Fourth of July!!!

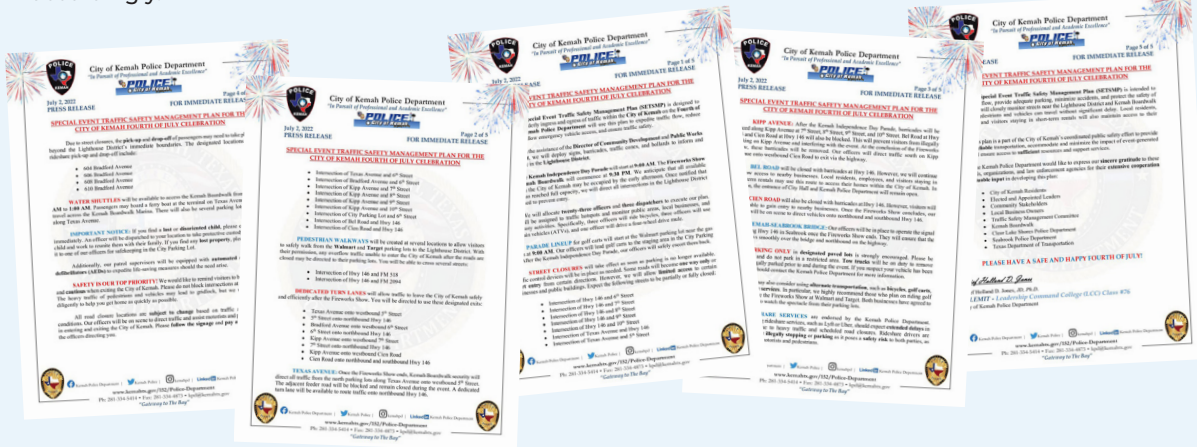
While everyone planned for good ole' wholesome fun, the Kemah Police Department spent hours, and even days strategically planning for the holiday that would grow the city's population by thousands!

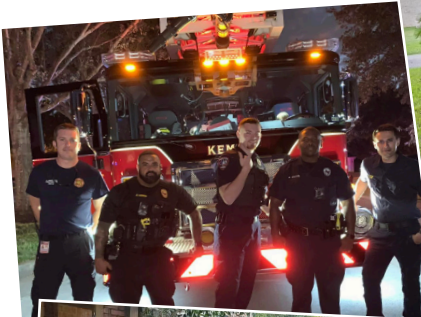


National Night Out 2022

Load Bearing Vest and Body Armor

The load bearing vest affords officers the opportunity to take some of the weight from their belts and carry it on their vests.

A special thanks to the Kemah City Council for approving the purchase of a vest to outfit every Kemah Police Officer.



Employee Assistance Program & Enhanced Officer Death Benefit

Kemah City Council unanimously voted during the 2022 fiscal year to increase the accidental death and dismemberment policy for Kemah Police Officers from a maximum benefit of 30,000 to 200,000 with an additional line of duty death benefit of 50,000.

This new policy reflects the city's mission to provide adequate and appropriate compensation to the officer's families if they must make the ultimate sacrifice for the City of Kemah in the line of duty. Huge shout out to the Kemah City Council and Chief Jones for making this possible and caring for our first responders!

The City of Kemah also offers employees access to an Employee Assistance Program as an additional benefit. These additional benefits are designed to help employees manage daily responsibilities, significant events, work stresses, or any issues affecting their quality of life. All services offered are confidential and at no cost to the employee! Being a part of our Kemah community sure is rewarding and appreciated!

Some of the many benefits of the EAP are law access, legal and financial services provided by a lawyer, and one to six counseling sessions per problem per year. Work/life services offer help locating daycare for children or medical care for an elderly loved one, researching consumer product and service information, evaluating the latest diet program, or finding the perfect pet sitter. *Go Team Kemah!!!*
